PRICING and CHARGES

Cutting Prices (ex GST)

Prices of cuttings are determined by the BGVSS on an annual basis and are currently as follows:

- (a) Standard varieties and clones
- (b) **SARDI Heritage Shiraz clones** (inc. royalty to SARDI)
- (c) **Tempranillo clones** (including royalty to AHVII)

Additional Charges

Charges for freight / delivery / shipping (where applicable) to the Purchasers address will be additional to the above and below prices and will be included in the BGVSS's Tax Invoice to the Purchaser.

Packaging and handling

A packaging and handling charge of \$57.00 + GST per 1,000 cuttings or part thereof will apply for any orders not collected by the Purchaser from BGVSS premises at Nuriootpa and requiring such packaging for shipping to the Purchaser's address.

The Purchaser shall be responsible for any other charges payable such as entry permits or fees to their State or region.

Cold Storage

Where cold storage of cuttings is required including hydration and sanitation before storage, **\$14.50 per 100 cuttings (excl. GST) will be charged.** This includes packaging and delivery to the Kersbrook cold store, and cold storage charges up until 1 December of the Order year. Any storage after that date may attract additional charges from Kersbrook cold store direct to the customer. Cold storing of cuttings beyond 6 months is not recommended.

An additional handling charge of \$45.00 (excl. GST) may apply to any cold store orders of less than 500 cuttings.

Minimum Charge

A minimum charge may apply to any single order of less than 500 cuttings. Such charges will be advised by the BGVSS at the time of ordering.

Deposit

A 25% deposit may be requested upon acceptance of an Order. A 25% deposit will usually apply for Orders of 5,000 cuttings or more. The BGVSS will advise at the time of Ordering if a deposit is required.

Invoicing

The BGVSS will issue the Purchaser with a Tax Invoice for the cuttings ordered:

- (a) on the date of collection by the Purchaser or despatch by the BGVSS; or
- (b) on the date of delivery to the Kersbrook cold store.

Payment Terms

Full payment must be received by the BGVSS within seven (7) days from the date of the Tax Invoice unless other payment terms have been previously agreed in writing with the BGVSS.

If payment is not received by the agreed date, the BGVSS may recover interest from the Purchaser on the unpaid amount at the Reserve Bank fixed cash rate at the time, plus 2%, calculated per annum per day and accrued from the due date up to the date of receipt of full payment.

If the Purchaser fails to pay for the cuttings and all other charges included in the BGVSS's Tax Invoice, the BGVSS has the right to reclaim the cuttings and resell them elsewhere and claim any loss on resale from the Purchaser as damages for breach of contract.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SUPPLY

- 1. Orders for cuttings will only be processed if the Purchaser completes and submits this Order Form in full and signs page 1 as acceptance of the terms and conditions of purchase as set out in this Order Form.
- 2. Orders must be received in writing on this Order Form to the BGVSS by email <u>before 18 July</u>. The acceptance of any orders after this date will be at the discretion of the BGVSS.
- 3. Orders will be filled / allocated in order of receipt of Order Forms that the BGVSS receives.
- 4. The terms and conditions of this Order apply to all transactions between the Purchaser and the BGVSS where the BGVSS supplies cuttings to the Purchaser. The Purchaser accepts these terms and conditions by signing this Order Form, or by its conduct if the Purchaser continues to instruct the BGVSS in person, by telephone, email or in regard to any subsequent changes to this order.
- 5. Un-rooted Dormant Grapevine Cuttings are as follows:
 - (a) Standard cuttings;
 - (b) Cuttings for grafting; and
 - (c) Thin cuttings, or cuttings to other specifications as requested by the customer (contact BGVSS to discuss)

6. SUPPLY

- 6.1 Supply of cuttings will be in bundles of 100 per variety / clone.
- 6.2 While every effort will be made to fill all orders, the BGVSS cannot guarantee supply.
- 6.3 The BGVSS will notify the Purchaser within fourteen (14) days of receipt of the Purchaser's Order if the BGVSS is unable to supply the cuttings requested.
- 6.4 Cuttings handled and supplied by the BGVSS will **not** be fully hydrated via water-soaking, but all cuttings are protected from dehydration from the time of cutting until collection by the Purchaser.

7. BGVSS PROPRIETARY SELECTIONS

Where applicable, the Purchaser agrees to sign a Non-Propagation Agreement and pay any applicable royalties as advised by the BGVSS at the time of order.

8. COLLECTION, DELIVERY and REGULATORY REQUIREMENTS

The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees:

- (a) to advise the BGVSS of the date by which delivery of the cuttings is required upon request by the BGVSS;
- (b) to take delivery of the cuttings at the BGVSS's office within 48 hours of collection notification; and
- (c) to pay all other charges included in the BGVSS's Tax Invoice; and
- (d) it is their responsibility to meet all necessary plant movement regulations applicable for grapevine cuttings which are to be introduced into their region whether locally or interstate.

9. TITLE and RISK

- 9.1 All rights, title and interest in and to the cuttings will vest in the Purchaser:
 - (a) at the time of collection by the Purchaser or despatch by the BGVSS from its premises; or
 - (b) at the time of delivery to the Kersbrook cold store by the BGVSS.
- 9.2 The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that upon:
 - (a) Collection of the cuttings by the Purchaser or despatch by the BGVSS; or
 - (b) Delivery of the cuttings to the Kersbrook cold store by the BGVSS,

the Purchaser will be responsible for and assume all risks associated with the cuttings and will take out and maintain insurance as the Purchaser may deem appropriate. Failure of the Purchaser to have insurance, inability to obtain insurance or any inadequacy of insurance will be at the Purchaser's own risk.

9.3 The Purchaser acknowledges the freight operator may not be a common carrier and agrees to be responsible for and assume risk of any loss or damage and all associated costs whilst the cuttings are in transit.

10. CANCELLATION or NON-COLLECTION

- 10.1 The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that cancellation of the Purchaser's Order will not be accepted by the BGVSS after cuttings have been harvested unless otherwise agreed at BGVSS's sole discretion
- 10.2 The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees to pay the BGVSS's Tax Invoice in full if non-collection of the cuttings occurs. No charges shall apply (and any deposit paid will be refunded) if an Order is cancelled <u>in writing</u> before those cuttings are harvested.

11. QUALITY and REPLACEMENT CUTTINGS

11.1 The Purchaser acknowledges it is their obligation to immediately inspect the cuttings upon receipt.

- 11.2 The Purchaser agrees to notify the BGVSS in writing if the quality of the cuttings is unacceptable within five (5) days of receipt and immediately return such cuttings to the BGVSS. The Purchaser must also advise the BGVSS of the exact nature and quantity of unacceptable cuttings whether part or all of Order.
- 11.3 If the Purchaser inspects the cuttings upon receipt, finds the quality is unacceptable, notifies the BGVSS in writing within five (5) days of receipt, and immediately returns such cuttings to the BGVSS, the BGVSS will replace such cuttings (up to the unacceptable quantity) providing that the BGVSS has sufficient supply.
- 11.4 If the Purchaser has complied with the terms contained in 11.3 and the BGVSS is unable to supply the quantity of replacement cuttings within a timeframe acceptable to the Purchaser, the BGVSS will reimburse the Purchaser for the cuttings cost paid only of the same quantity of unacceptable cuttings.

12. WARRANTIES and REPRESENTATIONS

- 12.1 The BGVSS warrants that it is a member of the South Australian Vine Improvement Association (SAVIA).
- 12.2 The BGVSS warrants that it complies with the Vine Improvement Nursery Association's (VINA) Accreditation Standards in respect of operating procedures, quality control and documentation relating to cuttings supply.
- 12.3 The BGVSS will use all reasonable efforts to supply cuttings which are as true to type as possible, sound and of the highest possible quality and optimal virus status, however on occasion, cuttings may have naturally occurring latent defects which the BGVSS cannot prevent or detect.
- 12.4 Except as otherwise expressly provided in this Order form, the BGVSS does not make any representations or warranties in respect of the cuttings whether express or implied, including but not limited to, warranties of merchantability or fitness for a particular purpose nor their subsequent performance in vineyards.
- 12.5 The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that:
 - (a) seasonal and source block conditions are beyond the BGVSS's control and may impact on the performance of cuttings such that the BGVSS cannot guarantee, warrant or make any representations as to the soundness, quality, viability or performance of the cuttings or the resultant planted vines
 - (b) the BGVSS is not able to warrant, and has not made any representations, that every cutting within an order or batch are completely free from every disease, virus or defect; and
 - (c) as such, the Purchaser has relied solely on their own judgement and expertise and purchases the cuttings at their own risk.

13. LIABILITY and LIMITATION OF DAMAGES

- 13.1 The Purchaser agrees that the BGVSS will not be liable if the BGVSS is unable to fill an Order in part or full
- 13.2 The Purchaser agrees to indemnify the BGVSS against any and all claims, demands, losses, damages and costs (including third party claims) in respect of the cuttings supplied except to the extent that such claims, demands, losses, damages and costs result directly from any illegal acts, default, omission, willful misconduct or negligence by the BGVSS.
- 13.3 The liability of the BGVSS for any and all claims, demands, losses, damages and costs (including third party claims) resulting directly from any illegal acts, default, omission, willful misconduct or negligence shall not exceed the amount of the price paid by the Purchaser for this Order.

14. COLD STORAGE, REHYDRATION and SANITATION

- 14.1 If cold storage is required, this requirement must be specified at the time this Order is placed (see page 1).
- 14.2 Refer to Additional Charges set out above for all costs associated with cold storage.

- 14.3 Cold storage of cuttings can be arranged by the BGVSS at the Kersbrook cold store (Kersbrook, S.A.).
- 14.4 All cuttings for cold storage will be sanitised (*Sterimax* dipped) unless the Purchaser requests otherwise at the time of ordering. The BGVSS recommends sanitation with cold storage to minimise the risk of fungal damage to cuttings.
- 14.5 The cold storage service includes hydration and sanitation, packing into plastic bags in pallet crates, transport to the Kersbrook cold store, and cold storage until 1 December of the Order year.
- 14.6 The Purchaser shall be responsible for:
 - (a) contacting the Kersbrook cold store (ph. 08 8389 3422) about cold storage and collection, and
 - (b) collection of their cuttings and all transport coordination and costs from the Kersbrook cold store, and
 - (c) collection of their cuttings no later than 1 December in the year in which this Order was placed, and
 - (d) rehydration of their cuttings before use.
- 14.7 The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that any Pallet Crates provided by the BGVSS for storage of their cuttings will remain the property of the BGVSS, and they will return these to the BGVSS depot in Nuriootpa as soon as possible after use. The BGVSS reserves the right to charge the Purchaser for any crates not returned within 30 days of collection from the Kersbrook cold store.

15. DISEASE and RELATED MATTERS

- 15.1 BGVSS may from time to time use experienced staff to visually inspect Source Blocks to identify obvious virus symptoms and insects, prior to certification in clauses 1.2 and 1.3.
- 15.2 Where the material has been certified by a third party:
- 15.2.1 certification is reliant upon diagnostics provided by third parties.
- 15.2.2 certification is given by that third party only, and is only reliable to the extent that:
 - the third party's such diagnostics are accurate (and a negative result may still mean that disease, virus or other defect is present but has not been detected); and
 - it uses the then-currently available diagnostics and scientific knowledge.
- 15.3 BGVSS may from time to time use experienced staff to carry out activities required under the certification scheme operated by VINA (under which BGVSS as member currently operates), or any replacement of that scheme from time to time.
- 15.4 As a result of clauses 15.1 to 15.3, and to the extent permitted by law:
- 15.4.1 BGVSS does not represent, guarantee or warrant that the material is free of disease, virus or defect.
- 15.4.2 Certification and testing is not a representation, guarantee or warranty that the material is free of disease, virus or defect.
- 15.4.3 material that has virus tested as positive does not comply with either the "A" or "B" Class grading, and BGVSS provides no representation, guarantee or warranty in respect of such material.
- 15.4.4 from time to time, material may have naturally occurring latent or other defects that, despite certification and testing, may not be prevented or detected.
- 15.4.5 BGVSS does not represent, guarantee or warrant that any particular or expected yield can be produced from the material, nor any other performance of the material.
- 15.5 The Purchaser acknowledges and agrees that it is their responsibility to assess the suitability of the material for its intended purpose, based on their own due diligence and agronomic advice, and to ensure that best practice vineyard establishment guidelines are followed.

16 QUALITY

- 16.1 It is the purchaser's obligation to inspect all material upon collection or delivery. The purchaser agrees to notify BGVSS in writing of any unacceptable quality or short delivery within 5 days of collection or delivery.
- 16.2 Subject to a claim being verified, BGVSS agrees to replace cuttings that are:
- 16.2.1 short supplied when advised in writing within 5 days of collection or delivery; or
- 16.2.2 not true to variety when advised in writing within twelve (12) months of collection or delivery. It may be necessary to wait until the following planting season for replacement cuttings.
- 16.3 In the event that 'A' class material is unavailable and the purchaser has not specified otherwise on their order form, the purchaser agrees to accept 'B' Class material.
- 16.4 The purchaser acknowledges that seasonal and Source Block conditions beyond BGVSS control may impact on material performance.

ANNEXURE 1.

SOURCE BLOCK INFORMATION

"A" CLASS - (Blue Labels)

- "A" Class Source Block procedures are audited/inspected annually by independent auditors to maintain integrity and compliance with the then-current Vine Accreditation Scheme Procedures Manual Part 1 – Vine Improvement procedures.
- The Source Blocks are planted under Vine Improvement supervision and are sourced from the Mother vines located in the SAVIA Monash germplasm. Older blocks have been propagated from material held in DPI collections and the CSIRO collection.
- Virus status: Following health inspections, randomly selected vines from the "A" Class Source Blocks are tested by third party, using the 13A PCR test. Results must be negative for Leaf Roll Type 1 (LRV1) and 3 (LRV3), Grapevine Virus A (GVA) as well as Grapevine Pinot Gris Virus (GPGV) for the Source Block to maintain "A" status. However, a negative result might still mean that such viruses are present but have not been detected.
- Source Blocks have had an ampelographic inspection for trueness-to-type by an external ampelographer.

"B" CLASS - (Pink Labels)

- "B" Class Blocks are used when there is no "A" material available.
- "B" Class Blocks are established by growers with commercially available material which may have come from "A" Class Blocks. Please request the block's history.
- Planting of "B" Class Blocks has usually not been supervised by Vine Improvement.
- "B" Class Blocks are the same as "A" Class in all other respects, with annual audit/inspections, virus testing and ampelography.

"M" CLASS - (White Labels)

- "M" Class Blocks are Mass Selection &/or Heritage blocks.
- "M" Class Blocks are non-Certified but undergo the same maintenance programme of annual audit/inspections, virus testing and ampelography.
- Contact BGVSS to discuss prior to ordering.

It is BGVSS policy to provide the **best available** material. In some instances, "A" Class material may not be available, or orders may exceed "A" Class availability. In this event "B" Class material will be supplied as standard practice. If this procedure is **not** acceptable, please state clearly on your order form "A" Class or contact BGVSS immediately. Please note this may restrict BGVSS ability to supply your requirements.

VIRUS POLICY

BGVSS is currently developing a new approach to virus testing, along with other Vine Improvement groups and nurseries. For this purpose, BGVSS will continue to use the services of third-party providers such as the (Australian Wine Research Institute or Crop Health Services at Agriculture Victoria. From time to time, BGVSS may make available material that has tested positive for virus, **but only where no clean material is available**. Such material does **not** comply with either the "A" or "B" Class grading.

BGVSS will **not knowingly** supply any material that has tested positive to **LRV3**. If material tests positive for **LRV1** or **GVA**, the Purchaser will be informed in writing. Ultimately, the decision to accept any virus-positive material rests with the Purchaser.

All decisions to accept virus-positive material must be provided by the Purchaser to BGVSS in writing. Where the purchaser has paid the deposit, BGVSS may provide any available virus testing results. If the Purchaser intends to on-sell or otherwise re-supply this material, they must make reasonable efforts to provide their Purchasers the same virus status information that was provided to them by BGVSS.

CUTTING COLLECTION AND LABELLING

Cuttings are generally harvested from Source Blocks from June through to early August. Cuttings are tied into bundles of 100. Each bundle is tagged with a colour coded label according to its Source Block class. The label identifies the Variety, Clone and Source Block Number. Bundled cuttings are collected daily from Source Blocks and delivered to the depot for washing and processing to fulfil order requirements. **To assist in traceability for any biosecurity alerts or varietal evidence, the purchaser is urged to keep written records of the BGVSS source block number, which is on the tag on each bundle.** Please note that supply of one variety/clone may be derived from more than one Source Block. Maintaining written records of the Source Block number enables material to be traced back to the exact Source Block which the material was sourced from. To assist in controlling the quality of our cuttings, each bundle will also have a label that identifies the cutter.

DEPOT PACKAGING AND PROCESSING

Cuttings are collected daily from each Source Block and washed (not soaked) with fresh water. The washing process is carried out according to the then current Vine Improvement Accreditation Procedures. Should your individual requirements differ to this process, please notify us at the time of ordering and ensure that you have this special requirement acknowledged. Cutting material is packaged to order in plastic bags. For large orders, material is packed into wooden apple boxes. This packaging protects cuttings from dehydration and physical damage during transport.

Cuttings are live respiring woody tissue so prompt collection (within 4-5 days) is essential. Cuttings must be stored in cool conditions – less than 20° C - and must not be allowed to dehydrate or rot under fungal attack. Cool storage should be limited to 3-4 months.

Each package has an individual **stock note** attached or delivery docket if picked up. This identifies the purchaser, contents, and indicates all treatments applied to the material.

The purchaser is notified when orders are ready to be collected.

DISPATCH

BGVSS will dispatch the order as per the purchaser's instructions. Failure to collect cuttings as arranged will attract a handling fee. BGVSS will not be responsible for any deterioration of cuttings resulting from failure to collect cuttings as arranged.

FREIGHT PICKUP

If you are unable to pick up your material in person, please indicate your preferred freight carrier and delivery address on the order form. BGVSS will then be able to make the necessary freight arrangements to deliver your material. We will notify you of the expected delivery date. Freight charges are additional to all other costs, and payable by the customer.

INTERSTATE ORDERS

Most states require a pre-shipment biosecurity approval for the introduction of grapevine material into their state. Please check with your local Department of Agriculture for the current biosecurity regulations applicable to your area. To avoid dispatch delays that may result in additional storage fees, a copy of your pre-shipment approval should be sent to BGVSS as soon as possible. A Plant Health Inspection fee will apply for each consignment dispatched.

COLD STORAGE SERVICE

Arrangements can be made for cuttings to go into off-site cold storage and, in this instance, charges will apply. The facilities used are of the highest quality but all cold storage is at the purchaser's risk. BGVSS will not be responsible for the deterioration of cutting material left for extended periods. Purchasers undertake cold storage entirely at their own risk.

ANNEXURE 2

MATERIAL DESCRIPTION

BGVSS takes reasonable care to ensure consistently high-quality material is supplied; however, changing seasonal and differing source block conditions that are beyond our control may result in performance variations of the material.

The propagation material measurements listed below are provided as a guide, not a guarantee. Please discuss with us any specifications you may have that do not conform to the material specifications set out below. Any variations must be confirmed in writing with BGVSS and may require a price variation. Diameters are measured just below top bud.

VITIS VINIFERA CUTTINGS

Planting Standard (STD)

STD material is suitable for rootling production:

- Length greater than 300mm and as straight as possible
- Diameter range 6mm to 12mm measured just below top node
- Minimum of 4 buds (including base bud)

Bench grade Standard

- Length greater than 300mm and as near straight as possible
- Diameter range 6mm to 10mm, measured just below top node
- Minimum 3 usable buds

Thin Grade

- Length >300 mm
- Diameter range 3mm to 5mm
- Minimum of 3 usable buds

A request for thin grade material should be discussed with BGVSS, as variety and seasonal conditions may result in cuttings being more expensive than standard grade.

Grafting Material (Bench and Top Grafting)

As the requirements of nurseries and field grafters are variable, please ensure you discuss your grafting requirements with the BGVSS Operations Manager. When your requirements are finalised, specifications must be confirmed in writing.
